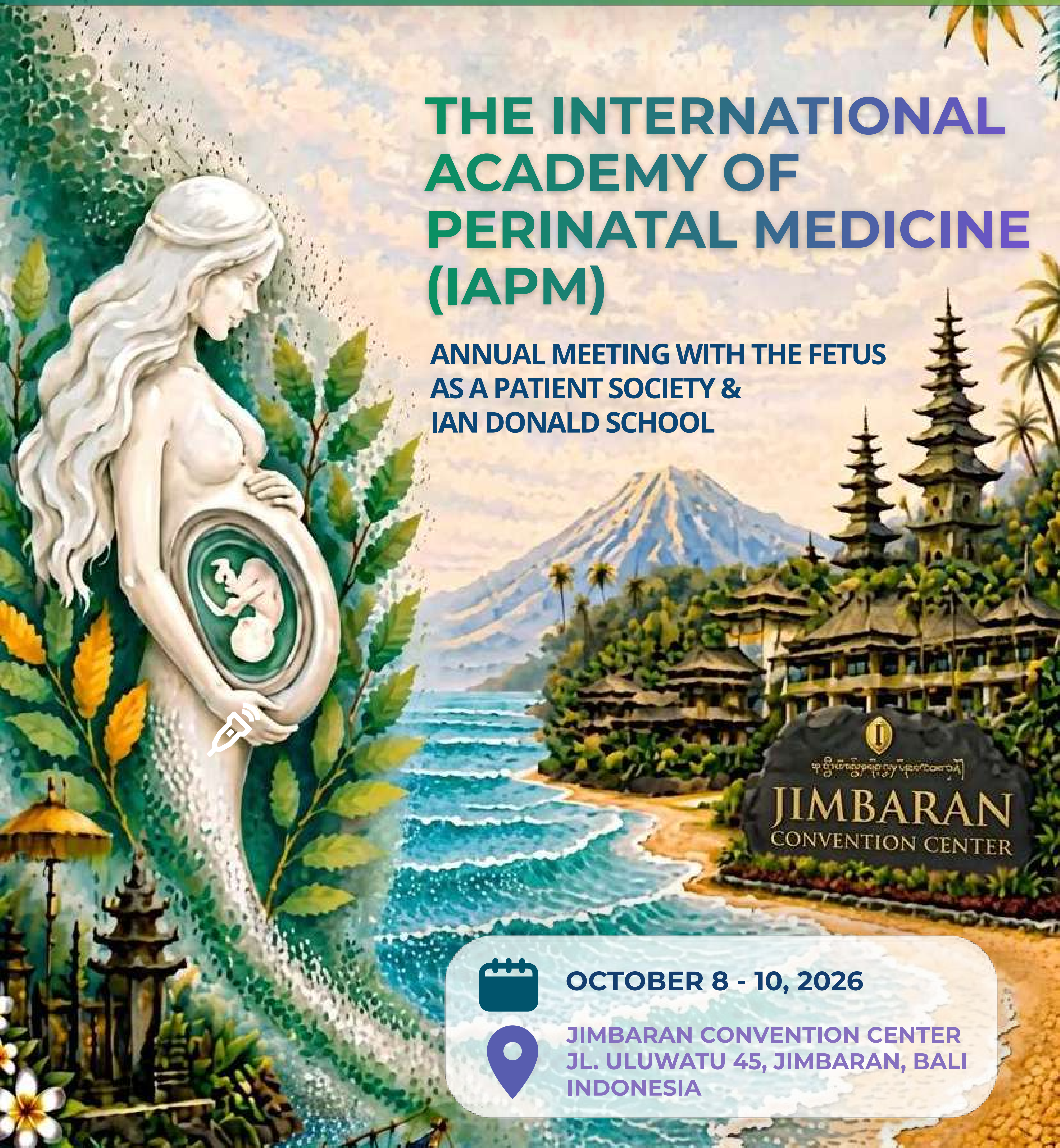


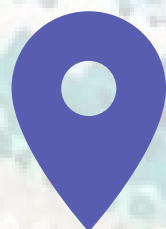

Venue Overview : Jimbaran Convention Center

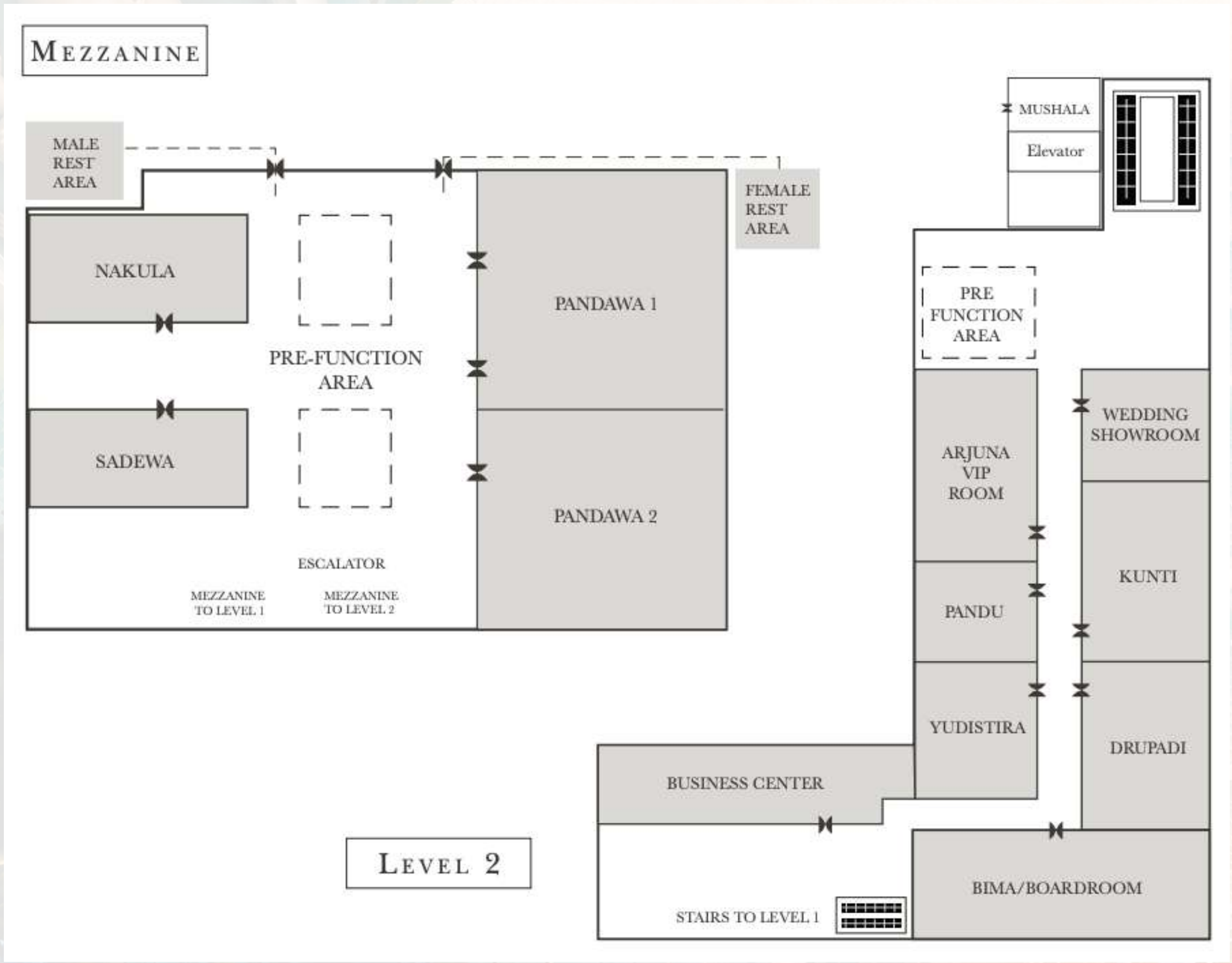
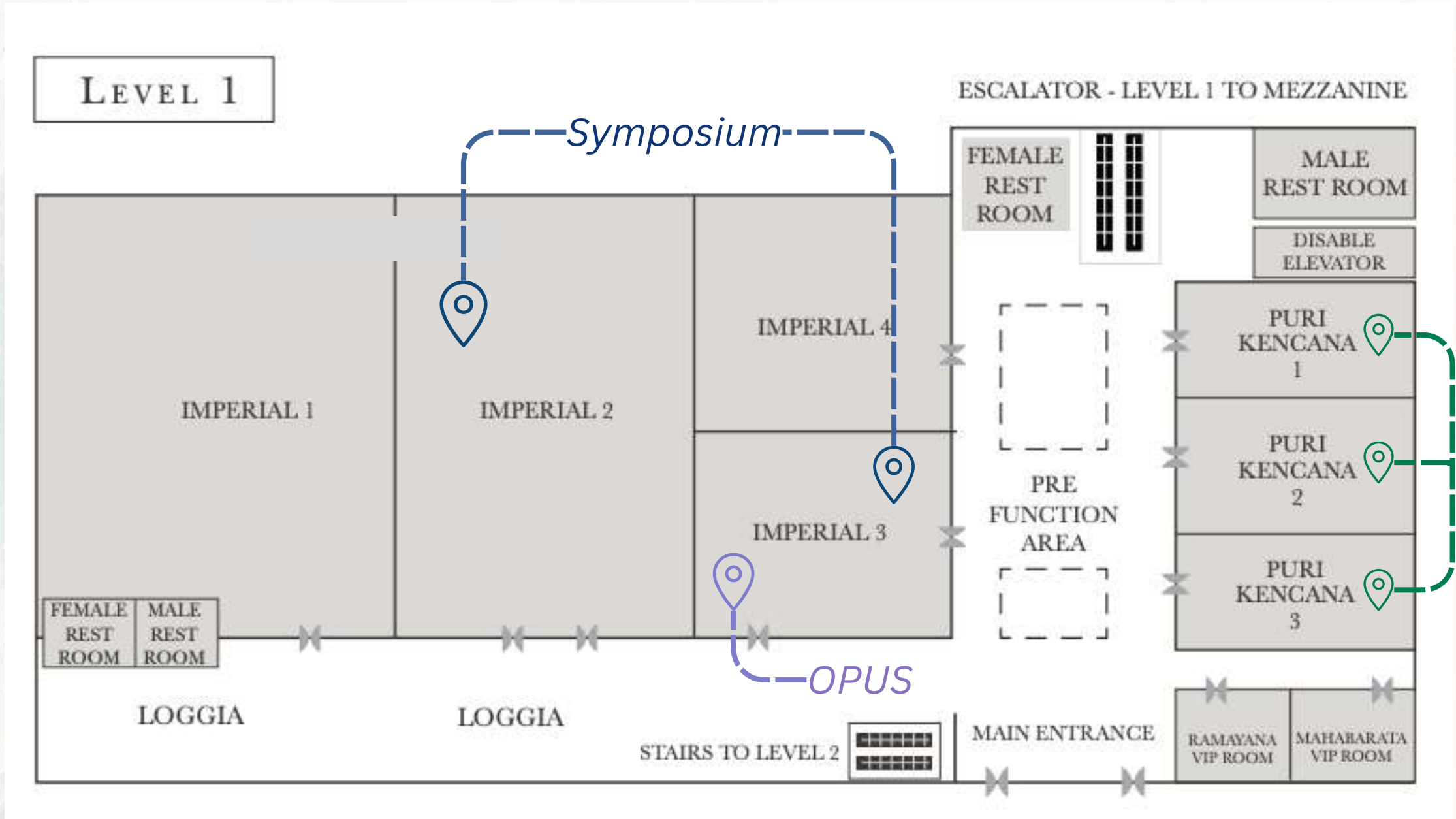

Visa Information

Participants are advised to check the applicable entry and visa requirements for Indonesia based on their nationality prior to travel.

- Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months from the date of entry into Indonesia.
- Eligible participants may apply for a Visa on Arrival (VoA) or Electronic Visa on Arrival (e-VoA), subject to Indonesian immigration regulations.
- Official immigration information regarding VoA eligibility can be accessed through the Directorate General of Immigration of Indonesia website: <https://www.imigrasi.go.id/wna/daftar-negara-voa-bvk-calling-visa>
- Upon request, the Organizing Committee can provide an official invitation letter and supporting documents for visa application purposes.
- Participants are encouraged to arrange their visas well in advance of their travel dates.

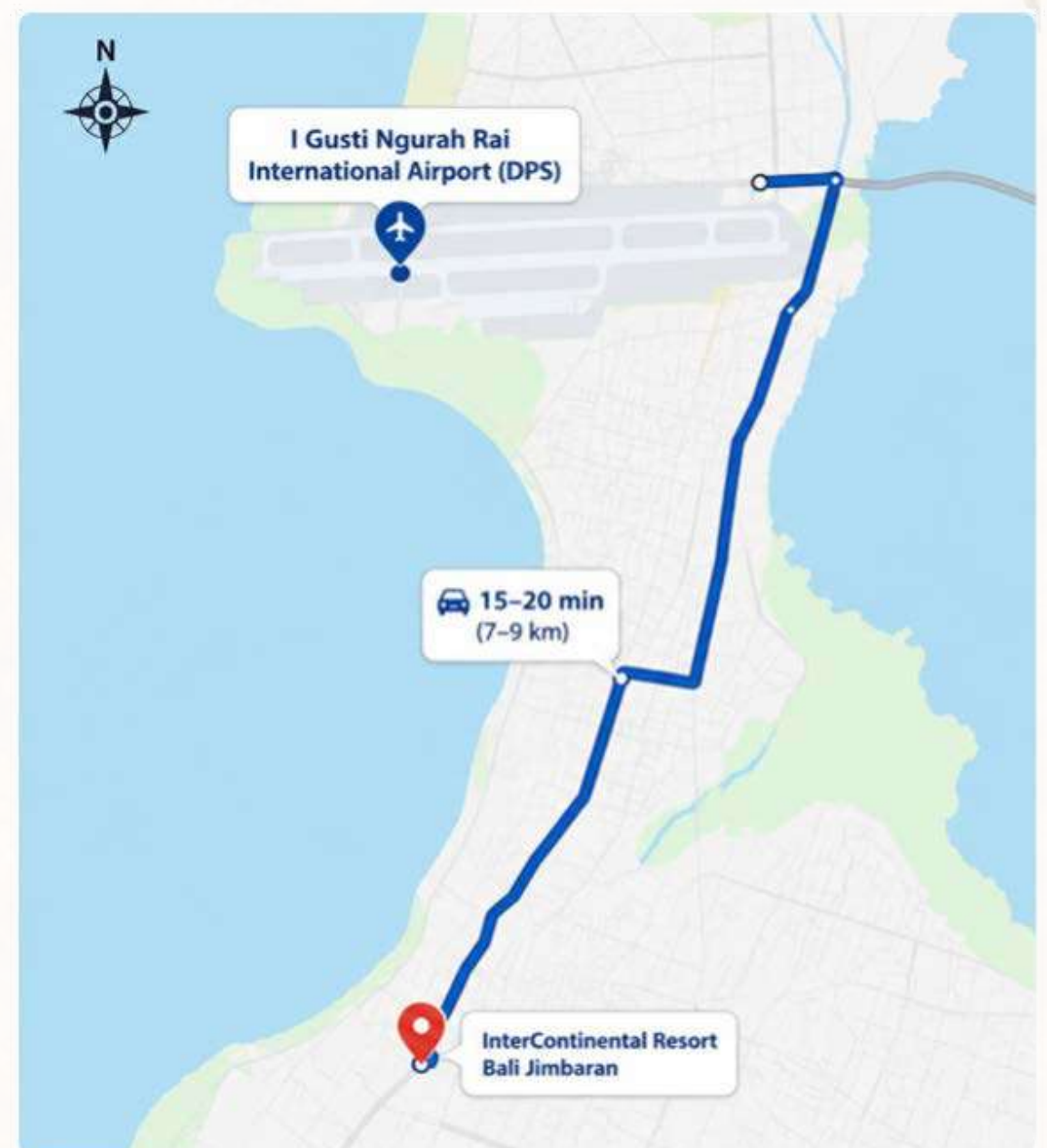
Airport Transportation Information

The nearest airport to the meeting venue is:

I Gusti Ngurah Rai International Airport (DPS)

Jl. Airport Ngurah Rai, Tuban, Kec. Kuta, Kabupaten Badung
Bali, Indonesia

The airport is located approximately 15–20 minutes from InterContinental Resort Bali Jimbaran, depending on traffic conditions. Participants are advised to arrange their flights according to the official meeting schedule.



Transportation Options from Airport to Hotel

Several transportation options are available from the airport to the hotel:

- Bluebird Taxi
 - Estimated travel cost: IDR 100,000 – 120,000 (USD 6-7). Participants may book a taxi through the MyBluebird application or use the official Bluebird taxi pool available at the airport.
- Grab / Ride-Hailing Applications
 - Estimated travel cost: IDR 120,000 – 150,000 (USD 7-9) depending on traffic and vehicle type.
- Hotel Pick-up Service
 - Airport transfer service may be arranged directly through InterContinental Resort Bali Jimbaran.
 - Estimated cost: IDR 430,000 net/car/way

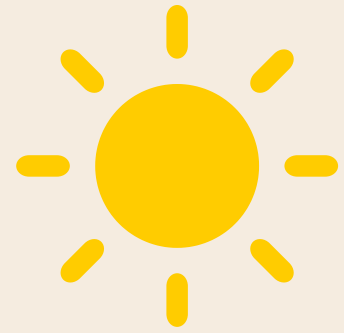


Exploring the island from the InterContinental Bali Resort is simple, convenient, and safe. Popular ride-hailing platforms such as **Grab** and **Gojek** operate seamlessly throughout the Jimbaran area, offering both car and motorbike options to suit your travel preferences—whether you need a swift motorbike ride through local traffic or the air-conditioned comfort of a private car. These apps provide clear, upfront fixed pricing and convenient cashless digital payment options.

For traditional metered transport, **Bluebird Taxis** remain a highly reliable choice; they can be easily hailed directly from the resort lobby or booked via **MyBluebird** mobile app. All mentioned applications (Grab, Gojek, and MyBluebird) are available for free download on both the **Apple App Store** and **Google Play Store**.

Finally, if you intend to take longer day trips to iconic destinations such as Ubud or Uluwatu, arranging a private car with a dedicated driver through the hotel concierge provides the most comfortable and flexible option for your journey.

Attire**

Bali enjoys a warm tropical climate year-round, with average daily temperatures hovering between 26°C and 31°C (78°F to 88°F). Relative humidity generally stays around 75% to 85%, though coastal locations like Jimbaran benefit from refreshing ocean breezes throughout the day.

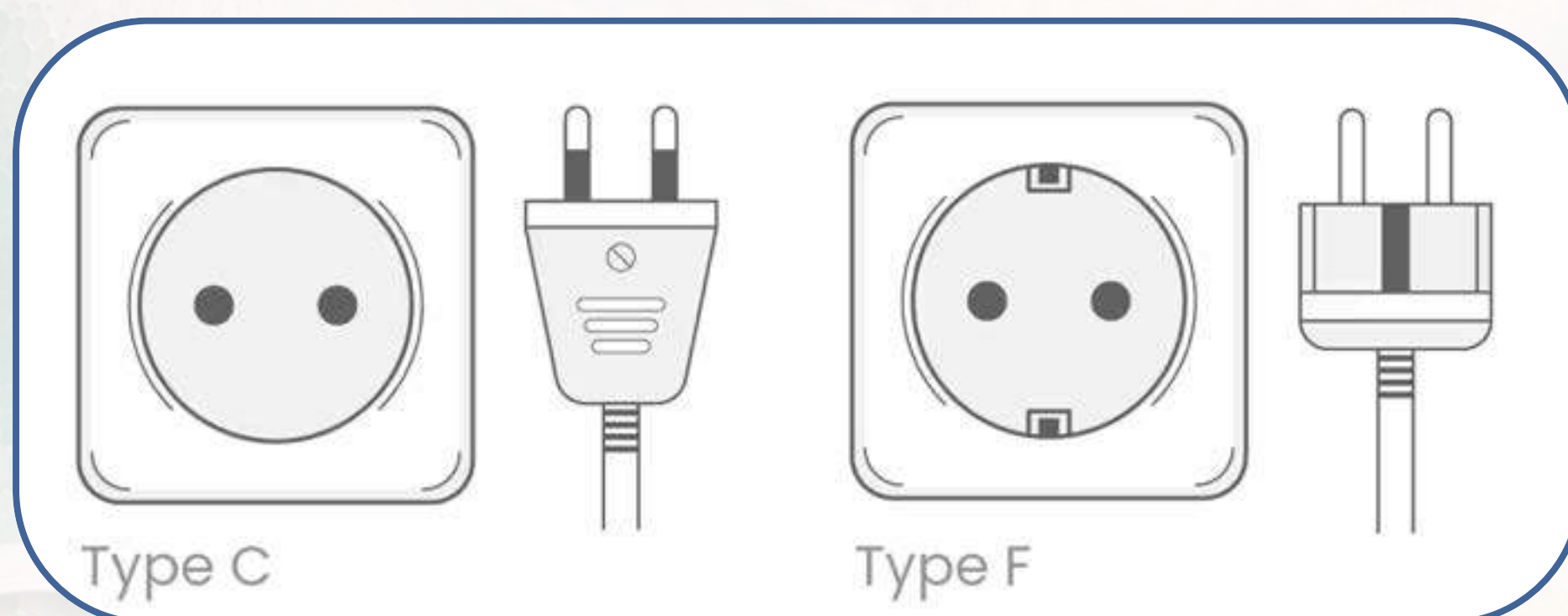
Light, breathable attire made from cotton or linen is recommended for daytime outings, alongside essential sun protection such as sunscreen, sunglasses, and a hat.

Bali operates on Central Indonesia Time (WITA), which follows UTC+08:00 (8 hours ahead of UTC).

General Information

Electrical Plugs

You may need an adapter in order to plug your appliances into the power sockets. In Indonesia, the primary plug types are Type C and Type F, both featuring two round pins. Indonesia operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz.



Currency

Indonesia's national currency is the Indonesian Rupiah (IDR), which comes in banknote denominations of 1,000, 2,000, 5,000, 10,000, 20,000, 50,000, and 100,000 IDR. Coins come in 100, 200, 500, and 1,000 IDR denominations.

Credit cards such as Visa and MasterCard are widely accepted at hotels, restaurants, and major retail outlets. A good tip is to carry some cash in local currency for small vendors or traditional markets. Merchants may impose small credit card surcharges in some places.

Traveller's cheques are not widely accepted in Indonesia, and it is recommended not to rely on them during your stay.

Indonesia applies a Value Added Tax (VAT) of 11 percent. Eligible international visitors may claim a tourist VAT refund on purchases made at participating "Tax Refund" stores at I Gusti Ngurah Rai International Airport prior to departing Bali.

General Information

Tipping

Tipping is NOT customary or mandatory in Indonesia, but small gratuities for great service are very much appreciated. However, most hotels, restaurants, and cafes will automatically add a 10 percent service charge plus government tax to the bill.

International Dialing Codes

The international dialing code for Indonesia is +62, and the area code for Bali is 0361.

Left – Hand Traffic

In Indonesia, cars, bikes, and other vehicles travel on the left-hand side of the road in bi-directional traffic. Pedestrians also walk on the left-hand side of paths and corridors in general. Look to your RIGHT first, then left, to check incoming traffic when crossing a street or road. Same rules apply when making turns while driving.

Recommended Bali Destinations

Uluwatu Temple

Travel time from InterContinental Bali Resort Jimbaran: 30 min

Distance: 18 km



Uluwatu Temple offers a memorable Balinese experience combining culture, scenery, and authentic local character. Perched dramatically on a 70-meter sea cliff at the southwestern tip of Bali's Bukit Peninsula, Pura Luhur Uluwatu is one of the island's six paramount temples. Sacred monkeys roam freely amid ancient stone gates, while the rhythmic crash of Indian Ocean waves creates an atmosphere of profound serenity. As the sun descends, witness the spectacular Kecak fire dance performed against a blazing horizon — an experience that transcends the ordinary. It is highly suitable for international conference delegates seeking a premium half-day or full-day excursion.

Recommended Bali Destinations

Garuda Wisnu Kencana Cultural Park

Travel time from InterContinental Bali Resort Jimbaran: 15 min

Distance: 7 km



Standing at a staggering 121 meters, the Garuda Wisnu Kencana statue is one of the tallest monuments in the world and a defining symbol of Bali's cultural identity. Depicting Lord Vishnu astride the mythical Garuda bird, the statue is crafted from copper and brass and towers above a stunning limestone plateau. The surrounding cultural park features open-air amphitheaters, traditional Balinese dance performances, artisan galleries, and panoramic views stretching to the sea.

Recommended Bali Destinations

Jimbaran Bay Seafood Dinner

Travel time from InterContinental Bali Resort Jimbaran: 5 min

Distance: 2 km



Just minutes from the InterContinental, Jimbaran Bay offers one of Bali's most beloved culinary traditions: dining on freshly grilled seafood directly on the beach as the sun sets over the Indian Ocean. Dozens of family-run seafood restaurants line the bay, serving grilled fish, prawns, lobster, squid, and clams accompanied by sambal matah, plecing kangkung, and steamed rice — all prepared to order. The combination of sand underfoot, gentle waves, candlelit tables, and a rotating cast of street musicians creates an atmosphere that is unmistakably Balinese.

Recommended Bali Destinations

Tanah Lot Temple

Travel time from InterContinental Bali Resort Jimbaran: 60 min

Distance: 30 km



Perhaps no image captures Bali's mystical essence more vividly than Pura Tanah Lot — a centuries-old temple perched on a rugged offshore rock, surrounded by crashing surf. At high tide, the temple appears to float on the sea; at low tide, visitors may walk across to its base and receive blessings from temple priests. The surrounding complex offers rice paddy views, artisan markets, and one of Bali's finest sunset panoramas. A cultural and photographic highlight not to be missed.

Recommended Bali Destinations

Sacred Monkey Forest Ubud

Travel time from InterContinental Bali Resort Jimbaran: 75 min

Distance: 40 km



The Sacred Monkey Forest Sanctuary in the heart of Ubud is a remarkable ecological and spiritual sanctuary home to over 1,200 long-tailed macaques. Ancient moss-covered temples dating to the 14th century are nestled among towering fig trees and lush tropical forest — an atmosphere simultaneously primal and sacred. The forest plays a vital role in Balinese Hindu religious practices, and resident monkeys are revered as holy guardians. Walking its forest paths offers a meditative contrast to urban life, and the proximity to Ubud's art galleries and culinary scene makes this a rich half-day cultural experience.

Recommended Bali Destinations

Tegallalang Rice Terraces

Travel time from InterContinental Bali Resort Jimbaran: 90 min

Distance: 45 km



The verdant cascade of Tegallalang's rice terraces is a living testament to Bali's ancient subak irrigation system — a UNESCO World Heritage-recognized cooperative water management philosophy rooted in the Hindu concept of Tri Hita Karana (the three causes of well-being). Stretching across a dramatic river valley north of Ubud, these terraces present a mesmerizing tapestry of emerald-green paddies, coconut palms, and traditional rice barns. Artisan stalls, organic cafes, and swing platforms perch along the ridge.

Recommended Bali Destinations

Tirta Empul Holy Spring Temple

Travel time from InterContinental Bali Resort Jimbaran: 90 min

Distance: 50 km



Pura Tirta Empul, meaning 'Holy Spring Water Temple,' houses one of Bali's most sacred water sources — springs believed to have been created by the god Indra over a thousand years ago. The temple's central courtyards feature two large purification pools fed by 30 waterspouts, where Balinese Hindus conduct elaborate ritual cleansing ceremonies (melukat). The hilltop views and adjacent Tampaksiring presidential palace add historical depth to the visit.

Recommended Bali Destinations

Ulun Danu Beratan Temple

Travel time from InterContinental Bali Resort Jimbaran: 120 min

Distance: 65 km



Perched gracefully on the misty shores of Lake Beratan in Bedugul, Pura Ulun Danu Beratan is one of Bali's most photographed and spiritually revered landmarks. Dedicated to Dewi Danu — the goddess of water, lakes, and rivers — this 17th-century temple complex appears to float ethereally on the lake's surface when waters are high, framed by cool mountain mist and lush volcanic peaks. As a major source of irrigation for much of Bali's rice-growing heartland, the temple holds immense agricultural and spiritual significance, embodying the island's ancient subak water philosophy.

Recommended Bali Destinations

Jatiluwiuh Rice Terraces

Travel time from InterContinental Bali Resort Jimbaran: 120 min

Distance: 60 km



Stretching across over 600 hectares of undulating highland terrain in Tabanan Regency, Jatiluwiuh Rice Terraces represent the most expansive and visually breathtaking expression of Bali's ancient subak irrigation system — a UNESCO World Cultural Landscape since 2012. Unlike the more compact Tegallalang terraces near Ubud, Jatiluwiuh offers an immersive, panoramic scale: tier upon tier of emerald paddies cascade down volcanic hillsides, fed by a centuries-old cooperative water-sharing system rooted in the Hindu spiritual philosophy of Tri Hita Karana — the harmonious relationship between humans, nature, and the divine. Winding trekking paths meander through active rice fields where Balinese farmers still work in rhythm with the seasons, offering delegates a rare and grounding encounter with one of the world's most sophisticated traditional agricultural systems.

Recommended Bali Destinations

Desa Penglipuran (Penglipuran Village)

Travel Time from InterContinental Bali Resort Jimbaran:

Approximately 90–120 minutes

Distance: Approximately 55 km



Recognized as one of Indonesia's most beautiful traditional villages, Penglipuran Village offers a rare glimpse into Bali's living cultural heritage. The village is renowned for its impeccably maintained bamboo architecture, clean pedestrian pathways, and strong commitment to preserving centuries-old traditions. Visitors can stroll through the charming village center, interact with local residents, and learn about Balinese customs.
